Richardson Maturity Model

Level 0

Use HTTP as a tunneling mechanism for doing RPC calls (think POX).

Level 1

Use URIs to address 'resources'.

Level 2

Use HTTP verbs (GET, POST, PUT, DELETE).


Level 3





